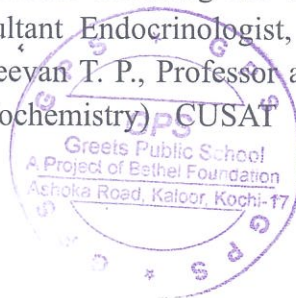
A significant milestone was the inauguration of Pre-KG, marking an expansion of the school's foundational learning initiatives. The occasion was graced by distinguished dignitaries including Film Director and Screenwriter, Mr. Jude Anthony Joseph, Superintendent and Treasurer, Mr. P. Silaskutty, Academic Director, Mrs. Jaya Sabin, Principal Administration, Mrs. Belinda Vivera and other esteemed members of the Management.

The school introduced 'Budding Blossoms', a sensory play programme for children aged 6 months to 3 years, aimed at fostering early developmental skills through structured engagement. The sessions focus on sensory-based activities that support overall development, including fine and gross motor skills, creativity and confidence. The program was graced by the presence of the Principal Administration, Mrs. Belinda Vivera, the Kindergarten Headmistress, Mrs. Sujatha Varma and the General Body Members, Dr. Mirash Thomas and Dr. Anoushka Thomsen.

The school recorded outstanding academic achievements in the AISSCE and AISSE Board (2024–2025) examinations. In the Class XII examinations conducted in March 2025, out of 140 students, 138 students (98.6%) secured Distinction, while 2 secured First Class. Notably, 30 students achieved A1 grades in all subjects. In the Class X examinations, 82 students appeared, out of which 72 students (87.81%) secured Distinction, while the remaining students achieved First Class. Among them, 12 students secured A1 grades in all subjects.

The Investiture Ceremony formally inducted student leaders into key roles including School Leader, Assistant School Leader, House Captains and Prefects. Justice Ajith Kumar, Honourable Judge of the High Court of Kerala, graced the occasion as Chief Guest. The newly elected leaders included Joel Abraham Anoop, Reem Musthafa, Steve Francis, Yohannan S. Anthraper and Fathima Zaara.

The Club Secretaries and Assistant Secretaries of various student clubs—Health and Mental Wellness Club, Eco Club, Mass Media and Photography Club, Social Service Club, STEM Club, Cultural Connectivity Club and the Bibliophiles Club—were conferred with sashes and badges. Vachasamrita Saiju, Co-founder, Lupus India and the Kochi Book Reading Club, Chief Belief Officer, Edubrisk.

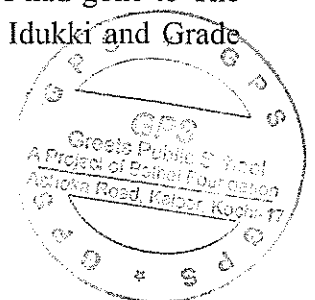

The Social Service Club's Outreach Programmes such as a visit to the Home for the Destitute at Perumanoor and the Onappudava Initiative reinforced empathy and social responsibility among students. Organized by the Health & Wellness Club and the Social Service Club, the Food Festival promoted healthy eating habits and teamwork, with a part of the proceeds directed towards charitable initiatives. The Eco Club organized a Pet Show offering an engaging blend of fun and experiential learning. Adding to its uniqueness, an elephant was featured for the first time, becoming the highlight of the event. Apart from birds and fish were different breeds of dogs like St Bernard, German Shepherd, various cats including a Bengal Cat and even a horse. The programme effectively fostered compassion, responsibility and awareness towards animals among students.

The fourth season of Tarantella 2025, an Inter-School Dance Festival held on 4th July 2025, witnessed enthusiastic participation from reputed institutions across the city. The grand Festival featured events such as Mirage Moves, Ranglok Nritya, Taal-e-Dhamaka and Bloom in the Colours of Spring.

The Talent Fest, conducted from 8th to 11th July 2025, showcased the artistic excellence of students through music, dance, poetry and art. Emerald House secured the overall championship, followed by Sapphire House and Ruby House. Ms Tanvi Ram graced both events, Tarantella and Talent Fest as Chief Guest.

The Onam festivities showcased the vibrant culture of Kerala with traditional dances, music and a sumptuous Onam Sadya. Students donned traditional attires such as kasavu sarees and mundu, immersing themselves in the spirit of the festival. Along with traditional dances from the students' and teachers' sides, parents too joined in and displayed mesmerising dance performances.

An International Study Tour to Malaysia which covered the breathtaking heights of the Petronas Towers to the exhilarating thrills of Genting Highlands and the enchanting beauty of the Batu Caves and many more iconic places was organised for students of classes VI to XII. The trip provided an opportunity for experiential learning outside the classroom where they were even able to complete airport formalities on their own. The outbound trip was a platform for students to cultivate camaraderie and bonding among them. A series of educational study tours enriched students from Grades I to XII with experiential learning opportunities. Classes I and II visited Nihara Resorts, Kothad. Class III and Classes VI to VIII visited Chittilappilly Square, Kakkanad. Classes IV and V visited Kalathil Resorts, Vaikom. Class IX visited Club Mahindra Resort, Arookutty while Class X had gone to The Windsor Castle, Kottayam. Grade XI visited GreenBerg Holiday Resort, Idukki and Grade XII had 2 nights and 3 days stay at Broad Bean Resort, Munnar.

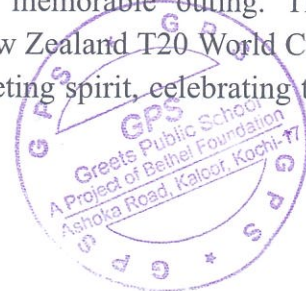

The Prefatory Speech was delivered by Adv Thomas Sabu Vaddakekut, Director and Deputy Chairman while the Inaugural Address was delivered by Adv Mohammed Shah, President, PTF. Students competed with enthusiasm and sportsmanship, showcasing their athletic talents and teamwork. Emerald House won the Overall Championship Trophy and Ruby House secured the Runner- Up position. The event promoted physical fitness, healthy competition and school spirit.

'Aureate Gala 2025', the 40th Christmas and Annual Get-together celebration was a grand culmination of the academic year, featuring cultural performances, skits and the grand award ceremony. The special dignitaries of the ceremony were Padma Shri Jayaram and his son Shri. Kalidas Jayaram. More than 1000 students graced the stage along with foot stomping performances from parents. All the participants showcased their talents and achievements, while parents and guests applauded their efforts and accomplishments throughout the year. Each event was meticulously planned and executed, enriching the school experience for students and fostering a sense of community and pride among all stakeholders.

The school actively undertakes a wide range of initiatives through the year across diverse fields, fostering social awareness alongside engaging, hands-on learning experiences thereby ensuring a vibrant and holistic educational environment.
